

TODAY'S READINGS

1st Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2;2:21-23
2nd Reading: Colossians 3:1-5,9-11
Gospel: Luke 12:13-21

When you die in the United States, your heirs and your estate may be subject to 'death taxes.' These include an inheritance tax levied by the state and an estate tax levied by the U.S. federal government.

If suddenly some misfortune were to happen to you, would your loved ones know what you want done? Illinois law allows for the following three types of advance directives: (1) health care power of attorney; (2) living will; and (3) mental health treatment preference declaration.

The health care power of attorney lets you choose someone to make health-care decisions for you in the future, if you are no longer able to make these decisions for yourself.

A living will tells your health-care professional whether you want death-delaying procedures used if you have a terminal condition and are unable to state your wishes. A living will, unlike a health care power of attorney, only applies if you have a terminal condition.

A mental health treatment preference declaration lets you say if you want to receive electroconvulsive treatment (ECT) or psychotropic medicine when you have a mental illness and are unable to make these decisions for yourself. It also allows you to say whether you wish to be admitted to a mental health facility for up to 17 days of treatment.

Under Illinois law, a health care 'surrogate' may be chosen for you if you cannot make health-care decisions for yourself and do not have an advance directive. A health care surrogate will be one of the following persons (in order of priority): guardian of the person, spouse, any adult child(ren), either parent, any adult brother or sister, any adult grandchild (ren), a close friend, or guardian of the estate.

You may also wish to consider your final arrangements. Do your survivors know your preferences for burial versus cremation? Do you want to have a visitation, a funeral Mass in church, burial in a Catholic cemetery? I am often surprised when funeral arrangements are being made for a daily Mass parishioner and the next of kin asks for a funeral parlor service, 'No Mass, please Father, I haven't been to church in years, and wouldn't know what to do. Some prayers at the parlor will be just as good.' Pre-planning your funeral may take the pressure off your survivors and ensure your final wishes will be carried out.

CELEBRATING OUR FAITH



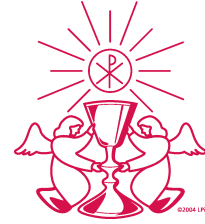
