TODAY'S READINGS

“In the dialogue between Jesus and Pilate, the subject matter is Jesus’ kingship and, hence, the kingship, the “kingdom”, of God... The center of the message, all the way to the Cross - all the way to the inscription above the Cross - is the kingdom of God, the new kingdom represented by Jesus. And this kingship is centered on truth. The kingship proclaimed by Jesus, at first in parables and then at the end quite openly before the earthly judge, is none other than the kingship of truth. The New Translation: the Dialogue

One of the most noticeable changes in the way we pray the Mass will come in the Preface Dialogue, an exchange between the people and the priest as we all get ready to enter into the most sacred part of the Mass, when the miracle happens: bread and wine become, truly and in their deepest essence, the actual body and blood of Christ.

Now the exchange goes as follows:

Priest: the Lord be with you	People: and also with you
Priest: Lift up your hearts	People: We lift them up to the Lord
Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God	People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The change will come in the first and last phrases. The first, we already have encountered and will see again at the end of Mass: instead of "and also with you," the people will say, "and with your spirit." This is closer to the Latin, and emphasizes that it is not the priest himself, as a man, that the people are corresponding, but with a man who bears the priesthood of Jesus Christ in his spirit.

In the last part of the exchange the people say will become "it is right and just." A simple declaration without much elaboration. We give thanks to God, because it's the right thing to do, and because we owe it to God as our creator and sustainer.

The memorial acclamation also changes. The most familiar of the current forms is "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." This form will be eliminated entirely because it is more theologically correct to pray that prayer TO Christ, not ABOUT Him.

The form that begins, "Dying, you destroyed our death..." will be changed to the more active: "We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again." Mr. Chadek will be teaching a sung version to us, as he already has begun to do with the school children.

One of the last, and my favorite, change comes at the Lamb of God, when currently the people say, "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed." We will return to a translation that makes more evident a punning reference to scripture, when the Centurion says to Christ, "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you under my roof, but only say the word and my servant shall be healed." But when we say "roof," we will mean the roof of our heads, and instead of "servant" we will say "soul."

Watch for special, color cards in the pews that will guide us through the new prayers and responses. We'll all have to read them for a while, until we get used to them, but soon they will feel as familiar and natural as the current forms.

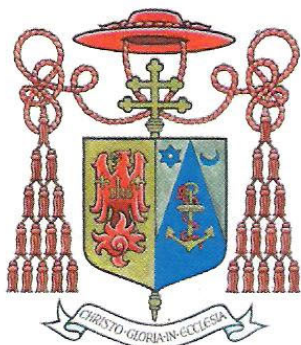
